**VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE & AVAILABILITY OF  
ABSENTEE BALLOTS**

**FOR SPECIAL TOWN ELECTION**

Concord's Select Board has called a Special Town Election for Thursday, April 14, 2016 to consider three ballot questions. The questions all ask voters to consider a Proposition 2½ debt exclusion under Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 59, §21C(k). The questions relate to Warrant Articles that are on the Annual Town Meeting Warrant, as follows:

- Ballot Question 1 – Concord-Carlisle Regional School District – Landfill Site Remediation  
(see also Article 14 of the Annual Town Meeting Warrant)
  
- Ballot Question 2 – School Transportation Facility – Supplemental Appropriation  
(see also Article 15 of the Annual Town Meeting Warrant)
  
- Ballot Question 3 – Minuteman Regional High School Building Project Approval  
(see also Article 18 of the Annual Town Meeting Warrant)

The deadline for registering to vote for the Special Town Election is Friday, March 25<sup>th</sup> at 8:00 pm. Residents who are not currently registered to vote in Concord who wish to vote must be registered by the deadline. Residents may register to vote in person at the Town House on Mondays through Fridays from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, or on March 25<sup>th</sup> until 8:00

pm. Registration may also be done online at [www.RegisterToVoteMA.com](http://www.RegisterToVoteMA.com) or by mail. Mail-in registrations must be postmarked by the registration deadline. If you are unsure if you are registered, you may verify your voting status through a link from the Town Clerk's web page – [www.concordma.gov](http://www.concordma.gov) – click “Elections & Voting” from the home page.

Polls will be open from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm on Election Day, April 14<sup>th</sup>. If you will be away from Concord during polling hours, or are unable to get to the polls in person on Election Day due to physical limitations or religious beliefs, then you are eligible to vote via absentee ballot. Absentee ballots are available in person at the Town Clerk's Office during office hours (Monday through Friday, 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, and Friday, March 25<sup>th</sup> until 8:00 pm) or a ballot may be mailed to you upon receipt of a written request. The deadline for absentee balloting is Noon on Wednesday, April 13<sup>th</sup>.
